Who Can Receive an Award?

Any current or retired CDOT employee that is in financial need after having experienced a life-changing event is eligible. Helping Hand defines a life-changing event as unforeseen emergencies that arise from medical conditions, fire, death, and other difficult circumstances.

No applicant will be denied eligibility on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, age, national origin, disability, sexual preference, or other non-meritorious factor.
